1) West Zone

- a) Continued work in Squares DI39 (with the NE corner of DI38 and the west edge of DH39)
 - Goal = identify the south end of the Beta Building and the function of the space intervening between it and the Alpha Building to the south
 - ii) Basket = 2497
 - iii) Starting elevation = 128.976 (high); 128.61 (low)
 - iv) Ending elevation = 128.810 (remains of staircase); 128.570 (possible floor in NE corner of space)
 - v) Soil is horizon 2
 - vi) Cleaned square for photography and in preparation for the removal of the remainder of the stairway. High confidence that the stairway was disassembled to build blocking wall to the west. Ashlars are of similar length.
 - vii) Ceramic analysis
 - (1) Mainly dating from 7^{th} to 8^{th}
 - (2) Stratigraphic context: Sq. DI39
 - (3) Description: A lot of cooking vessels and Beisan jars from UMM period, some juglets and lamps; handle of a cooking pot with a stamp (probably a horse)

 - (5) Residual: KFH cooking pot type 1E (mid.3th-early 5th AD)


