- Continued work in the "gathering hall" (Squares DH40 south with the NW corner of DI39 and the east edge of DG39) and DH39 North (i.e.,
  - a. Goal = identify the south end of the Beta Building
  - b. Basket = 3141
  - c. Starting elevation = 128.63 (128.60 on bench?)
  - d. Ending elevation = 128.44
  - e. Soil = horizon C (white and chalky)
  - f. Removed a number of large stones, mostly basalt (destruction fill)
  - g. May have a part of a limestone feeding trough
  - h. A glass base from the fill may provide a basis for dating the space. Minimal other small finds.

  - e. Soil is Horizon A (top soil and tractor fill) with some appearance of Horizon B


