 - a. Goal = identify the structure and function of Beta Building
 - b. Basket = 3158
 - c. Starting elevation = 129.69 (west), 129.64 (east)
 - d. Ending elevation = 129.67
 - e. Soil is Horizon B
 - f. Removed an additional 30 cm of heavy destruction fill from south to north at the level of the top of the surviving walls 2114 and 1946. Squared up room to interior line of walls, although identification of the particular interior walls is difficult, except on the south side.



- f. Reached level of late plaster floor (F2119). Survives best next to the northerly shelf and in NE and SE corners. In the middle and toward the west, less of the floor survives.


