

## 1. Continued work in DQ39

- a. Goal = to identify the SE corner of the HTyche
- b. Basket = 3171
- c. Starting elevation = 133.06
- d. Ending elevation = 132.31(average west of W1298), 132.14 (average east of W1298)
- e. Soil = horizon B
- f. Identified both sides of the eastern wall (W1296) in the southern two thirds of the square. Solid Roman construction on the east face (two courses)
- g. Followed the south face of the northern wall (W1917) to a junction with the east wall. Therefore, the previously identified *cubiculum* seems to be outside the HTyche. As there is no access to the rest of the house. It is also a possibly later construction.
- h. Ceramic analysis
  - Mainly dating from 6AD
  - ii. Mainly dating to 8AD
- iii. Stratigraphic context: The room near the Tyche house, East from the N-E church (DQ-39)
- iv. Description: A big quantity of pottery; Mostly medium sized fragments of cooking vessels and Bet Shean jars, a lot of LRC ware, several big AMP shards
- v. Indicative wares: LRC form (Hayes) form 10A from 6 AD 7AD; LRC (Hayes) form 3F from 6 AD; ARC (Hayes) 91B form from 450 AD 530 AD; Late BYZ UMM casseroles; UMM cooking lead (parallel to Bet Shean, Bar Natan 2011, fig 11.17/1)



## 2. Continued work in BP41

- a. Reopened F1284 in the sleeping chamber east of the apse to see if there might be a low bench on the east wall.
- b. Basket = 3172
- c. Starting elevation = 130.60
- d. Ending elevation = 130.59 (bench), 130.32 (foundation trench)
- e. The bench is about 17 cm tall and 75 cm wide. Could it be another sleeping platform? It seems to run the length of the east wall.
- f. Ceramic analysis
  - i. Mainly dating from 7AD
  - ii. Mainly dating to 8AD
  - iii. Stratigraphic context: Room from East side of the central apse (DP 41)
  - iv. Description: Mostly medium sized fragments of jars and cooking vessels;

v. Indicative wares: Bet Shean jars (parallel to Bet Shean, Bar Natan 2011, fig 11.3/6) from 7 AD - 8AD; Archedrim basin rim (parallel to Magness, form 2A) from 6 AD - late 7 AD
