

1) West Zone

- a) Continued work in Squares DI39 (with the NE corner of DI38 and the west edge of DH39)
 - i) Goal = identify the south end of the Beta Building and the function of the space intervening between it and the Alpha Building to the south
 - ii) Basket = 2488
 - iii) Starting elevation = 129.248 (average); 129.439 (top of blocking W2103 between Alpha and Beta buildings)
 - iv) Ending elevation = 129.052
 - v) Soil is horizon b
 - vi) Brought average level down.
 - vii) Not certain that broken lintel stone was a step. Perhaps it was the west end of a platform. It aligns with the single stone wall in the alpha building
 - viii) Ceramic analysis
 - (1) Mainly dating from 7th to 8th
 - (2) Stratigraphic context: Sq. DI39
 - (3) Description: A lot of pottery, especially cooking pots,lids and casseroles, made from black or brown material, dating to BYZ/ UMM; ARS

 - vii) A narrow limestone stairway rises to the east in the south east corner of the room. Eight stairs remain. Tread 15-22, rise 22-24. Elevations of the steps are: 128.766 (Bottom step); 129.041 (Step 2); 129.214 (Step 3); 129.451 (Step 4); 129.636 (Step 5); 129.881 (Step 6); 130.095 (Step 7); 130.272 (Step 8)



- viii) There is a doorway in W1250, exterior to the south; 128 cm wide is the opening. The door was 138 wide.
- ix) Numerous nail fragments were discovered near the door.
- x) Two coins also turned up. A Byzantine M coin in the fill and an Umayyad coin in the doorway. A third coin (? Very light) was found in front of the stairs.


