1) West Zone

- a) Continued work in Squares DH39 (with the NE corner of DH38 and the west edge of DG39)
 - Goal = identify the south end of the Beta Building and the function of the space intervening between it and the Alpha Building to the south
 - ii) Basket = 2493
 - iii) Starting elevation = 129.052
 - iv) Ending elevation = 128.976 (high); 128.61 (low)
 - v) Soil is horizon 2
 - vi) Continued lowering the level. Possible stairs from the west. Only pieces of eastern steps remain. Steps may have been robbed for western blocking wall.
 - vii) Toward the end of the day, a possible level appearing in the northeastern corner.
 - viii) Ceramic analysis
 - (1) Mainly dating from 6th to 8th
 - (2) Stratigraphic context: Sq. DH39
 - (3) Description: A lot of pottery, especially casseroles, cooking pots, lids. There are also Beisan jars.
 - (4) Indicative wares: FBW bowl (6th-late 7/8th AD), lid from the end of BYZ/ UMM (6-mid 8th AD); ARS (7th AD)



- b) Continued work in DJ39
 - i) Goal = identify the structure and function of Beta Building
 - ii) Basket = 2494
 - iii) Starting elevation = 130.272
 - iv) Ending elevation = 129.403 (high); 129.261 (low)
 - v) Soil is horizons A and B mixed
 - vi) Removed tilting heavy stone from top of square, including one lintel stone 155 x 23 x 40
 - vii) A thin wall of limestone blocks may face the western side of W1239 (these may be the interior face of the wall also) and seem to allow upward continuation of the stairs.
 - viii) As the day progressed, these limestone blocks appear to be the inside of W1239.
 - ix) At the north end of the square, the wall tips inward toward the room some 30 cm.
 - x) Again, very little pottery in the fill.
 - xi) By end of the day, excavation of the area was about half done and be were into L1243

 - i) Goal = identify the structure and function of Beta Building
 - ii) Basket = 2495
 - iii) Starting elevation = 128.826 (mud/plaster floor)
 - iv) Ending elevation = 129.806 (high); 128.849 (low)
 - v) Soil is horizon b
 - vi) Removed more of the upper level material from the square/
 - vii) Discovered a door jamb 4.98m from the exterior of W1250. The exterior of the door is to the south. At least two courses sit next to W1239 (an addition?). The western jamb is not yet visible.
 - viii) Continued to follow the interior of W1244 to the west. The better constructed earlier wall continues to supply the lower courses of the wall
 - ix) Ceramic analysis
 - (1) Mainly dating from 7th to 8th
 - (2) Stratigraphic context: Sq.DJ40
 - (3) Description: A lot of body shards mainly of jars and cooking vessels

- (4) Indicative wares: Beisan jars, casserole (Magness form 1, early 3th-9th AD), CRS (mid.7th-mid.8th from Beith Shean, Bar Natan 2012, fig.11.39\4, (from Hayes form 9B))

- a) Continued work in Square DR41.
 - i) Goal = Excavate and identify the function of the eastern room of the peristyle house
 - ii) Basket = 2496
 - iii) Starting elevation = 130.834 (high); 130.593 (low)
 - iv) Ending elevation = 130.500 (average of plaster floor)
 - v) Soil is horizon B
 - vi) Many tesserae in the fill, continuing an earlier trend.

- vii) Various types of door hardware recovered: possible hinge, a latch, nails, etc.
- viii) Several pieces of painted fresco were recovered from the fill. They seem to portray portions of a disk or medallion with a gold center crossed by red lines (a sun disk?).
- ix) Toward the end of the day reached what seems to be a crude plaster floor (later?).Question: if it is a plaster floor, how did all the tesserae get into the fill above it?
- x) Ceramic analysis
 - (1) Mainly dating from mid-4th to 5th
 - (2) Stratigraphic context: Sq.DJ41; possibility o the mixed material because of the destruction of western wall
 - (3) Description: Small amount of pottery, mostly body shards of jars
 - (4) Indicative wares: KFH 1E (mid.3rd early 5th), necklace cooking pot with triangular rim (parallel to late ROM \ BYZ; 4th-7th AD); ARS form 67 (Hayes pp. 112-116; 360-470 AD)
