- a) Continued work in Squares DH39 (with the NE corner of DH38 and the west edge of DG39)
 - Goal = identify the south end of the Beta Building and the function of the space intervening between it and the Alpha Building to the south
 - ii) Basket = 3103
 - i) Starting elevation = 128.810 (remains of staircase); 128.570 (possible floor in NE corner of space)
 - iii) Ending elevation = 128.234 (average of probe); 128.346 (top of corner fixture)

 - v) Sorted through and cleaned parts of collapsed wall to the west



- iii) Starting elevation = 129.231 (top of threshold in W2108); 128.810 (packed earth floor next to W1244 in west part of square); 128.983 (possible stone platform north of threshold)
- iii) Ending elevation = 128.471 (north probe); 128.508 (south probe)
- iv) Soil is dark and moist; many bones and small sherds.
- v) Exposed the mud/plaster floor. Removed stone resting on it or penetrating it.
- vi) Opened two probes in the mud floor (each 1 x 1 m)

- vi) Began to remove fill north of the lower level of the window wall (basket 3107)
