General Description and Soil Analysis

Light gray (10YR 7/2) dry, very stony sandy loam, grayish brown (10YR 5/2) moist; massive; firm; assumed to be calcareous (by color).

Chronology of Excavation

- 15 July
 - Starting Elevation = 130.63
 - o Ending Elevation = 130.58
 - Recovered a 2nd/3rd century Roman oil lamp under the south door, under a stone that served as a base for the mosaic floor. As the lamp was in the plaster, it provides a terminus a quo for the building (not very helpful). The lamp was 49 cm west of the tomb wall (W514) and 17 cm below the threshold elevation (130.60).
