General Description and Soil Analysis

Soil in L528 is redder than others cited and compacted. It underlays the plaster base of F516.

Chronology of Excavation

- 17 July
 - In Square B3
 - Starting elevation = 130.93
 - Ending elevation = 130.83
 - Removed W514 west of the tomb. The stone wall was set on the floor. The chancel screen channel and W514 were plastered together and over (chunks of plaster filled the channel and adhered to the stones of the wall)
 - A marble facing for the sarcophagus on the west side was damaged and tilted away. Under the plaster covering it, a cross

inscription was revealed. As with the cross inscription on the north face, the cross is "teutonic" in form, each of the arms flaring to points. Small disks or dots are inscribed just beyond each point.

- Some loose plaster on the NW corner of the sarcophagus was removed revealing a sarcophagus with a lid and box
 - Measurements
 - Cover is 23 cm thick

20 July

 - Cleared L528 west of tomb to the level of F516
