- Continued work in Square B2a
 - Starting elevation = work inside the limestone box
 - o List of architectural items -- none
 - Continued removing dirt from around bones.
 - o Finished extraction of bones.
 - Did last of bones of the body and then extracted the skull and remains under it.
 - Discovered the remains of two additional skulls in the dirt and fragments on which the third skull sat.
 - Observations on the exhumation
 - The first two in the tomb died earlier (a generation) before the third
 - Although some bones are in approximate burial position, most bones showed significant disruption. For example, the head of a femur at the west end of the bone (opposite burial position).
 - There were concentrations of small animal bones at the head and foot of the box
 - No evidence of cloth, beads, or coins
 - Bits of plaster (some showing red or yellow painting) were retrieved.
 - Box seems to have settled to one side
 - West end had more moisture in the soil (condensation on the boards every morning)

 - We continue to recover a large number of pieces cut on angles. Probably used to construct arches/domes
