General Description and Soil Analysis

The dominant soil profile in this area is as follows:

A horizon - 0 to 15 cm; dark grayish brown (10YR 4/2) dry, very stony sandy loam, very dark brown (10YR 2/2) moist; weak fine granular structure; friable; 10 percent pebbles, 15 percent cobbles, 30 percent stones; clear wavy boundary. (Range in thickness 5 to 20 cm) B horizon - 15 to 55 cm; grayish brown (10YR 5/2) dry, very stony sandy loam, dark grayish brown (10YR 4/2) moist; very weak, coarse subangular blocky structure; 10 percent pebbles, 15 percent cobbles, 35 percent stones; irregular boundary. (Range in thickness 25 to 65 cm)

Chronology of Excavation

12 Sept 04: Began work in Square E2

- Starting elevation = 131.05
- Ending elevation = 130.66
- Soil is Horizon A/B
- List of architectural items
 - A fragment of lead plating (?) was recovered in the sweep by the metal detector just east of the main door)
- Dug a 1m-wide trench on the exterior of W511 in a northerly direction.
- Identified a central doorway with a width of 128 cm and a door width of 143 cm. At this level, it seems as if the boor was intentionally blocked.
- 13 Sept 04: Continued work in Square E2
 - Starting elevation = 131.09
 - Ending elevation = 130.62
 - Soil is Horizon B
 - Clarified that the main doorway to the nave had been blocked at some time later in the history of the church. A small diameter column drum (see columns in C0) and several blocks are laid flush with the exterior of W511)
 - The opening for the nave doorway begins 6.4m from the SW exterior corner of the church
 - To the west of W511 is a flagstone floor (F545) that overlays a mosaic floor (F546). A portion of the mosaic floor (F546) is visible next to W511 running south from the doorway for the nave
 - About 4m from the SW exterior corner is some sort of installation
 56cm wide and octagonal in shape. It is partially plastered over.
 Its function is unclear.
 - On the mosaic (F546), there is a swirl border approx 21 cm wide running next to W511.
 - Plaster from the mosaic floor (F546) curves up the wall in spots,
 indicating that the exterior of W511 was plastered.

 - Starting elevation = 131.623
 - Ending elevation = 131.132
 - Soil is Horizon A/B
 - Removed surface rubble and fill
- 20 Sept 04: Continued work in Square E3
 - Starting elevation = 131.132
 - Ending elevation = 130.80
 - Soil transitioned from Horizon B to C (switched loci from L505 to L548)
 - Continued to remove rubble and fill
 - Oil lamp recovered at 131.01
- 22 Sept 04: Re-opened Square E2
 - Starting elevation = 131.446
 - Ending elevation = 130.95 to 131.25
 - o Soil is Horizon B
 - Returned doorjamb to place from which it fell
 - Typical rubble and fill
- 26 Sept 04: Opened Square E1
 - Starting elevation = 131.407
 - Ending elevation = 130.904
 - Soil horizon is B
 - o List of architectural items none
 - Many building stones removed from the ruins
 - Floor was cleaned in E2 after plaster was removed. A similar band of mosaic is visible north of the main door as was visible south of it.
