General Description and Soil Analysis

C horizon - light gray (10YR 7/2) dry, very stony sandy loam, grayish brown (10YR 5/2) moist; massive; firm, hard in places near the floor; 10 percent pebbles, 10 percent cobbles, 20 percent stones; assumed to be calcareous (by color).

Chronology of Excavation

- 8 Sept 04: Continued work in Square C1
 - Starting elevation = 130.76
 - o Ending elevation = 130.65

- Soil is Horizon C
- Part of day was spent repairing W521, reinserting collapsing stones including two corbels.
- Revealed a bench running from the previously exposed segments in D1 to the base of the chancel screen. Bench is 7.34 m in length (east to west). Its width varies from 43-51cm. All pieces are basalt, except the block closest to the chancel screen base. The top of the bench is at the level of the chancel screen base. From east to west, the lengths of the stones are: 34cm, 74cm, 82cm, 82 cm, 83cm, 81cm, 82cm, 82cm, 82cm, and 50cm. Those of 81-83cm length appear to be corbels identical to those in the wall! The level of the north stylobate averages 15cm below that of the bench.
- 9 Sept 04: Continued work in Square C1
 - Starting elevation = 130.65
 - Ending elevation = to west 130.47, to east 130.39 (both are levels of mosaic)
 - o Soil is Horizon C
 - While removing some of the last cm of rubble west of the chancel screen base at the north end, we recovered a fragment of the chancel screen that had been at the head of the north aisle. It is made of a soft material similar to what was recovered from the channel of the chancel screen base last year.
 - While cleaning next to the bench, we discovered mosaic tile going under the bench.
 - Therefore the bench is from a secondary phase of the church, even as is the bench in the south aisle.
 - The north bench is made of corbels identical to those used in the north wall (W521).
 - Therefore the wall repair is from the same secondary phase of the church

- Perhaps the column bases North of W521 were part of an entrance closed in a secondary reconstruction. Such an entrance might explain the configuration of the column bases in the north aisle.
- Excavation of Square C0 is recommended.
- 12 Sept 04: Continued work in Square C1
 - Starting elevation = to west 130.47, to east 130.39 (both are levels of mosaic)
 - Ending elevation = 130.55 (mosaic), 130.52 (pebble base)
 - Soil is Horizon C
 - Started to reveal floor working from the chancel screen base. Red and black tile are discernable in places
 - A nail was recovered from the fill
 - Sieving applied to all dirt from the square. Some to be sent off for floral/faunal analysis.
- 13 Sept 04: Continued work in Square C1
 - Starting elevation = 130.55 (mosaic), 130.52 (pebble base)
 - Ending elevation = 130.55 (mosaic)
 - Soil is Horizon C
 - Continued the cleaning of last fill above the mosaic.
- 14 Sept 04: Continued work in Square C1
 - Starting elevation = 130.55 (mosaic)
 - Ending elevation = 130.55 (mosaic)
 - o Soil is Horizon C
 - Finished clearing remainder of dirt covering mosaic floor (F538)
 - The mosaic floor is in fragmentary condition with only the pebble base still visible in spots.
 - One section of mosaic was partially cleaned revealing a square pattern. The central square has stair-step lines of mosaic tiles running diagonally: brown, black, white, yellow, white, black, pink, cream, and black. The square is outlines in black. Smaller squares

are at each point of the original square. They are outlined in black. On one side the field color is pink. On the other side the field color is yellow. Black-trimmed rectangles complete the pattern on each of the four sides. The field color is white.
