General Description and Soil Analysis

The soil was redder in color and more compacted. It appeared to be more developed. The soil dug easily.

Chronology of Excavation

- 6 Sept 04: Continued work in Square B2a from 2003
 - Starting elevation = 130.02-129.98 in L543 (area surrounding limestone box)
 - o Ending elevation = 129.88-83 in L543
 - Soil is Horizon C (moist)

- Removed 10-12 cm soil from area between limestone box and basalt ashlars that form the cavity for the tomb.
- Recovered several indeterminate bones for this external fill on the south side.
- 3 Oct 04: Continued work in Square B2A
 - Starting elevation = 128.88-83
 - o Ending elevation = 129.53
 - Soil is Horizon C
 - Resumed work inside the cist tomb chamber on the north side of the sarcophagus box
 - Recovered a glass fragment identical in form to the glass earlier recovered inside the sarcophagus box.
- 4 Oct 04: Continued work in Square B2A
 - Starting elevation = 129.53 (next to sarcophagus box in cist tomb)
 - Ending elevation = 129.17 (floor of chamber of cist tomb)
 - Soil is Horizon C
 - Some spots of darker soil below sarcophagus box (decomposed coffin?)
 - Excavated between the north side of the sarcophagus box and the north wall of the chamber. Reached a smooth limestone floor at a depth of 1.42m below the top of the chamber. The narrow section of the floor visible between the box and the chamber seems to be one stone (limestone slab?)
 - The sarcophagus box in the cist tomb sits askew on stones 27-33
 cm above the floor of the chamber
 - Recovered 15 complete or fragments of nails from beneath the sarcophagus box. In some spots the soil was distinctly darker (suggesting decomposition of wood). Also retrieved one vertebrae that might be human (sent for identification). Perhaps the sarcophagus sits atop the remains of an earlier coffin.

- The sequential burials in the sarcophagus, even the placement of the sarcophagus into the chamber, are later than the construction of the chamber of cist tomb.
- The chamber of the cist tomb is constructed of four courses of ashlars. The bottom course is 37cm high. The blocks from west to east are 38cm, 34cm, 56cm, 38cm, 49cm. The second course is 35cm high. The blocks from west to east are 28cm, 55cm, 50cm, 49cm, 34cm. The third course is 40cm high. The blocks from west to east are 40cm, 68cm, 37cm, 71cm. The top course is 21cm high. The blocks from west to east are 58cm, 74cm, 26cm, 57cm.
- The interior opening of the chamber is 0.97m (width, north-south),
 2.17m (length, east-west), 1.42m deep. A comparative chart shows similarity to other burial chambers on the site:

- External dimensions of the sarcophagus box are 0.60m wide,
 2.02m long, 0.53m deep. Sidewall thickness is 11cm; end
 thickness is 13cm. Internal depth is 34cm at west (head) and 38cm at east (foot). The curve of the west end of the sarcophagus begins
 30cm from the top.
- 5 Oct 04: Continued work in Square B2A
 - After cleaning, measurements and photography, valuable architectural fragments were placed in the sarcophagus. The covering stones were put in their original position. Then cloth was placed over the tomb.
 - The center part of the chancel was refilled with earth to the level of F516.

 The stone base and the opus sectila flooring were replaced north of the tomb as were the pieces of opus sectila south of the tomb
