### **Chronology of Excavation**

- 27 Sept 04: Continued work in Square B2a
  - Starting elevation = 130.774
  - o Ending elevation = 130.527
  - Soil is Horizon C
  - Under the plaster of F517 was a base of flat stones at 130.64

- Under the flat stones was a base of pebbles
- The north line of the opening was plastered vertically . . . running east/west. Could this plaster have joined with the plaster that originally sealed the tomb? So, the foundation for the first building was bounded on the north by the line of the stylobate, on the east by the line of the apse, and on the west by the chancel screen base. The latter was not plastered, so the chancel screen base may have cut the line, even as the stones for F517 cut the plaster.
- 28 Sept 04: Continued work in Square B2a
  - Starting elevation = 130.527
  - Ending elevation = 130.36
  - o Soil is Horizon C
  - Very hard under two layers of sub flooring
  - Vertical plaster to north and east of the opening
  - Some sort of socket (canopy?) toward the west end, but no comparable one to the east end
  - Recovered some plaster yellow background with black stripes
  - Little discernable structure (other than framing plaster). Some support stone to the north of the cist tomb wall on the east half of the opening.
- 3 Oct 04: Continued work in Square B2A
  - Starting elevation = 130.36
  - Ending elevation = 130.29
  - Soil is Horizon C
  - Continued to excavate the area immediately north of the cist tomb
  - Revealed a Byzantine ionic capital with plaster on it as the foundation for the north corner of the apse. The reuse of this distinctively Byzantine form suggests borrowing from a previous church structure.

 Hard plaster/concrete made excavation difficult. There was no other discernable socket as in the westerly section of the small excavation area. Stopped further excavation.
