- Continued work in Square B4
o Starting elevation $=132.15$
o Ending elevation = 132.20 (square brought to level)
o Soil is Horizon C
o Two fragments of door jambs were recovered
- Continued work in Square D0
o Starting elevation $=130.58$
o Ending elevation $=130.42$
o Soil is Horizon A
o Cleaned the installation in the southwest corner of the north lateral chamber. It was plastered and collected water (from the roof) for the cistern. Water was collected in a bowl and then channeled through the wall and flowed down a plastered surface into the cistern. Outside dimensions of the basin are 49 x 49. Inside dimensions are $34 \mathrm{~cm}(E / W)$ and $37 \mathrm{~cm}(N / S)$. The channel through the wall is approximately 15 cm wide and 10 cm high.
o Installation next to the north wall is also a collection basin for a cistern. The eastern half is plastered and seems more natural as such a collection basin. The western half appears to be destruction fill. What appears to be a corner sits above the eastern wall of the cistern. Significant destruction fill remains.
o The steps in the north lateral chamber rise an average of 20 cm per step. If the steps continued to W539, they would be at a height of 2 m , sufficient to reach a second story. Evidence of supporting structure for stairs east of W539 will be significant.
- The two collection basins in the north lateral chamber may suggest that the chamber was a courtyard and not roofed. But the dirt and plaster floor suggest an interior space.
