- Continued work in Square B/C0
o Starting elevation $=131.50$
o Ending elevation = 131.27
o Soil is Horizon B
o At elevation 131.20, discovered a section of an aqueduct pipe on its side with the opening up. The opening is 30 cm is diameter and plugged with dirt, ceramic fragments, and stones. If it is a cistern head, the round lid would be 42 cm . It is carved from a block about $58 \times 58 \mathrm{~cm}$.
- Continued work in Square B4
o Starting elevation $=131.50$
o Ending elevation = 131.32
o Soil is Horizon B
o Pushed to the west in B4 to recover the inside line of W554. W559 is X.XXm from W512. [We have now crossed the south line of the square into B5 to get to the inside of W554 and have crossed the west line of the square into C 4 to get to W559.]
o A small probe was dug next to W559, revealing a hard plaster floor at 130.88.
- Continued work in Square E4 west of W552.
o Starting elevation $=131.07$
o Ending elevation = 130.91
o Soil is Horizon B
o Uncovered the opening of the cistern into which street water drained. The opening (intentionally blocked in antiquity) is oval in shape ( 44 cm east to west
and 57 cm north to south). The cistern is more than 5 m deep. The carved top of the cistern is 130.46
o Reached a mud/plaster floor (F568) west of W552. The floor is quite similar to the floor in the north lateral chamber, but not as hard (mostly mud).
o All work was done south of the line of F562, which may turn out to the part of a wall into which the pavers were integrated.
