- Continued work in Square B0
 - Starting elevation = 131.84
 - Ending elevation = 131.68
 - o Soil is Horizon A
 - o Removed more destruction fill and fall from W520.
 - Did some surface work in A0 in an attempt to identify the exterior of the eastern wall of the church. Portions are still uncertain
- Continued work in Square B/C0
 - Starting elevation = 130.96
 - \circ Ending elevation = 130.72
 - Soil is Horizon B
 - o Continued to remove destruction fill
 - Bench(?) against wall (W560) is emerging.
- Continued work in Square B4
 - Starting elevation = 131.20-130.89 (floor)
 - Ending elevation = 131.09-130.88 (floor)
 - o Soil is Horizon C
 - o Continues to clear the floor (F570) to the south
 - The bench on the west wall goes all the way to the SW corner of the room (3.0x0.65m)
 - There is a bench on the north wall (W510) between the bases for the arches.
 It protrudes into the room about 8cm
 - The upside down column base in the NW corner is 69cm in diameter.

- There are a number of lacunae in the floor where the plaster has broken down.
- Completed work in Square E4
 - Starting elevation = 130.69
 - \circ Ending elevation = 130.48
 - o Soil is Horizon B
 - o F562 turns out to be a wall (and so is renumbered).
 - To the south of W562 are three floors.
 - The first (F568) is plaster and mud and was at a level (130.82) that may have made it difficult to use the door. The top of the threshold is 130.90. It is similar to the mud/plaster floor north of W562 and in the north lateral chamber.
 - The second floor (F571) is made of stones at level 130.69 and seems to match up better with the door threshold
 - A third floor (F573, black basalt pavers) may be in evidence next to W562 at 130.48
 - There is a round sealed fixture under the second floor (130.61) that may be a access point to the cistern. Suggesting that the cistern went out of use at the time of F571.
 - The wall on the south end of the square (W569) is contemporaneous with or later than F571 as it sits on a stone on the end of the cistern (130.59). The stone is in parallel with F571.
- Started work in Square E3 west of W513
 - \circ Starting elevation = 131.74
 - Ending elevation = 131.27
 - o Soil is Horizon A
 - o Destruction fill including a drum and a pseudo ionic Byzantine capital.
