- Continued work on Square ZZ99south
 - o Goal follow W1266 to the east looking for corners.
 - Starting elevation = 130.196 (average north of wall), 130.195 (average south of the wall), 130.593 (top of W1266)
 - Ending elevation = 130.005 (paving next to pilaster), 130.433 (top of opus quadratum), 129.964 (NE corner)
 - The doorway in W1266 is quite wide. Initially there was a passageway 2.10m wide. It was then closed by a doorway 1.62m wide with a door 1.73m wide. The westerly section of W1266 is opus quadratum and is 0.705 m wide.
 - The north side of W1266 has two layers of plaster visible.
 - A nail (#348) and a section of an imported shell (abalone) were recovered from the fill between the door jambs.
 - Retrieved a section of marble molding (#349) from the fill with a hole (for hanging?) in back.
- Opened Square ZZ1
 - Goal examine area north of W1261 and the fixture tentatively identified as a robbed staircase.
 - Starting elevation = 131.853
 - \circ Ending elevation = 131.603
 - o Removed surface fill
- Continued work on Square ZZ2/3

- o Goal follow W1261 to the east, looking for corners to the south and north.
- Starting elevation = 131.563
- Ending elevation = 131.509 (top of W1270)
- Continued to reveal the north to south wall (W1270). It is well build and has a consistent flat top.
- At the south end of W1270 where it abuts W1235 is (surprisingly) a door jamb the exterior of which faces west. The jamb indicates that the complex continues to the east.
- The cistern in A2 was refilled with fill from the room east of the apse.
- Continued work on Square A99north
 - o Goal follow W1267 and W575 to the north looking for corners.
 - Starting elevation = 129.904 (between W1267 and W575, aka "street")
 - Ending elevation = 129.455 (between W1267 and W575, aka "street"),
 129.873 (threshold in W575), 129.861 (average east of W1267)
 - o Levelled the street area and removed destruction fill from the top of walls,
 - Defined more clearly the pilaster on the East side of W1267 in the NE corner of the square. It too is plastered.
 - More nails were recovered near the north doorway of W575 (#343 13.5cm and #344 15.5cm), and more tesserae to the west of that wall.
- Continued work on Square F5
 - Goal investigate unknown area.
 - Starting elevation = 130.330
 - Ending elevation = 130.107 mud/plaster floor (F1275), 129.884 (average below the floor)
 - Exposed to the level of the mud/plaster floor (F1275).
 - o #345 2cm coin found on floor.
 - o #346 7cm nail
 - o #347 7 cm nail
 - \circ Discovered a series of three walls the tops of which aligned with the floor
 - One runs parallel to and is slightly exposed under the south side of W569
 - One is parallel to the street about 2m west

• One is parallel to W569 in the south part of the square.

We presume these are part of a pre-existing building. The area is rich in small finds including a coin at floor level.

- Continued work on Square F8
 - Goal follow paved surface to the west.
 - Starting elevation = 129.262 (average destruction fill), 129.442 (average of room in SW corner).
 - Ending elevation = 129.126 (average of room in SW corner), 129.292 (average destruction fill)
 - Continued to remove destruction fill from the plaza area and from the room in the SW corner
 - o #382 fragment of weight(?), white, 6cm
